*Crohn's disease occurs when the Immune System attacks the digestive system. It is a chronic condition with no known cure. Treatment options are to use drugs to try to control the symptoms, put the disease in remission and prevent relapse. When this type of treatment fails, surgery or surgeries are needed. Surgery does not cure the disease either, as it can recur. Some people with Crohn's in the large intestine may have to have the entire colon removed, which is what has happened with Cecilia. We hope and pray that after she recuperates from the surgery, she can go on to live a full and productive life.
